Disposal of Nuclear Waste

Prior to arriving at Michigan, Dr. Ewing was a Professor in the Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences at the University of New Mexico where he was a member of the faculty for 23 years. His professional interests are in mineralogy and materials science, and his research has focused on radiation effects in complex ceramic materials and the long-term durability of radioactive waste forms. Dr. Ewing has conducted research in collaboration with colleagues in Russia, Sweden, Great Britain, France, Germany, Australia, China, and Japan, as well as the United States

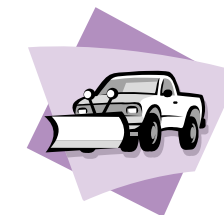

Tuesdays at 2:30, beginning Jan. 24, Dante's Paradiso (Gerulaitis)





Second Wednesday of the month at 10:30 Chamber Music Study (Meiland)
