Wednesday, June 1, 5:00 pm

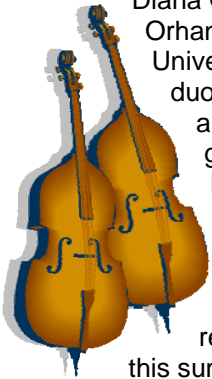
Friends of the Ann Arbor Greenway will discuss their efforts to promote the creation of a full-scale public park and greenway system in the Allen Creek floodplain.

Intracerebral Hemorrhage—New Developments in a Bad Disease,

Monday, June 6, 5:00 pm

Dr. Julian T. Hoff, professor and immediate past Chair of Neurosurgery, and Dr. Lewis B. Morgenstern, Director of the Stroke Program, (and son of UC resident Frieda Morgenstern) will discuss bleeding strokes. Their talk will consider the very latest in diagnosis and treatment of intra-cerebral hemorrhage, including new medications and surgical technology.



Our Quest for Speed: An Introduction to Space Propulsion, Wednesday, June 15, 5:00 pm

Dr. Alec D. Gallimore, UM professor of Aerospace Engineering and of Applied Physics (and son of UC resident Kathleen Gallimore) directs the Plasmadynamics and Electric Propulsion Laboratory and of the NASA-funded Michigan Space Grant Consortium. He will review the technological advances humanity has made in its quest for speed, as well as research at UM enabling the building of the fastest machines in history: space vehicles.

UM Music Student Recital: James McCain, Saxophone, Saturday, June 18, 7:30 pm

A recital toward his Master's degree in saxophone performance, James McCain earned his Bachelor's from the Peabody Conservatory of Music. He recently accepted a position with the US Military Band at West Point, NY, starting in the Fall. His program represents a variety of influences, including jazz, Indian music, and a piece composed in memory of the Holocaust. He will be accompanied by Pianist Wenli Zhou.



Klezmer Music – A History and Inside Perspective, Wed., June 22, 5:00 pm

Daniel Ducoff, dance leader with the world-renowned Yiddische Cup Klezmer Band of Cleveland, will discuss the evolution of klezmer music and dance from biblical to modern times. Ducoff, who calls himself a "shtick-meister," was inspired by the late Mickey Katz, and will include music and

possibly some audience participation. This promises to be great fun!

Vintage Couture, the 1920s-1960s Fashions of Elizabeth Parke Firestone, Saturday, June 25, 10:00 am

Field trip to The Henry Ford Museum for a rare glimpse into the wardrobe of one of America's best-dressed women of the mid-20th century, including 50 dramatic dresses created by some of the era's most talented designers.

Re-source Ensemble – composers' recital, Tuesday, June 28, 8:00 pm

Organized by four University of Michigan composers, Re-source Ensemble is dedicated to the performance of new works as well as recomposed versions of older music. By juxtaposing music from various periods in history, the Re-source Ensemble hopes to reveal the often unrecognized relationships between the music of the past and contemporary music. The concert will feature new works by Christopher Dietz and Andre Myers, and new versions of pieces by Frescobaldi, Rameau, and J.F. Rebel. The works will be presented by an ensemble ranging from voice and piano to a mixed ensemble consisting of eight players.

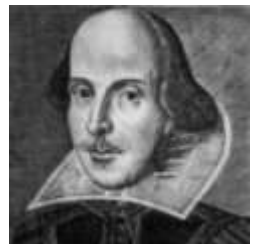




