Thurs. May 6 & Fri. May 28 - 9am - Noon






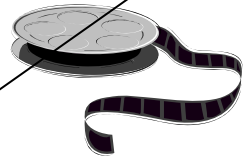
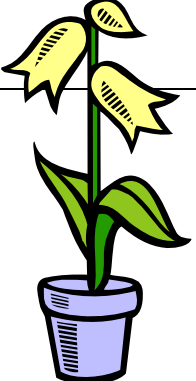
