Her talk will explore the issues and ideas surrounding art restoration of our time, with particular emphasis upon the cleaning of the frescoes of Massacio in the Brancacci Chapel, the *Last Supper* of Leonardo, the Sistine Chapel, and a Self-Portrait by Rembrandt. Does restoration mean the destruction of a work of art? To what extent should we preserve historical changes made to a work over time?
