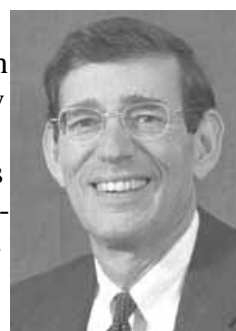

#### Common Time

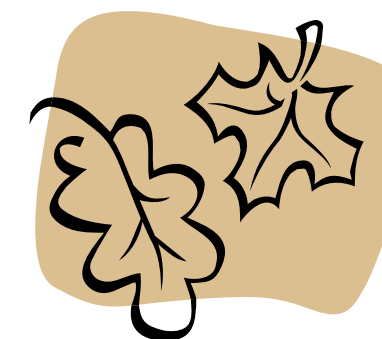
Every Fri - 4:30-6:30 pm
